Featured Trip-Raptor to the backside of Santa Cruz Island-6 spots left



On Saturday, June 26th, CIDA has a charter aboard the [Raptor](#) out of Ventura Harbor for a trip to the back side of Santa Cruz Island. The backside of Santa Cruz is full of excellent dive spots with most being around the Anchorages such as; Albert's, Willows and Laguna Harbor. Then there is Bowen Point and dive spots up against the island, like walls or steep slopes. Most of these spots have healthy kelp forests, fish and plenty of marine life to see and can be good for hunting, photo or sightseeing. The depths range from 20'-80' and visibility from 20'-60'

The plan is to do a longer run up the backside and depending on the weather and currents make the 1st dive a 60'-80' dive, and then start the trip back making a 2nd and 3rd dive at two other good dive sites between 30'-60' deep. This trip is longer than normal for the [Raptor](#) and is specifically being made for CIDA. Most dive boats don't get up to the back side of Santa Cruz very often, so most of the sites are seldom dived. **This trip is good for intermediate divers and above. There could be possible currents at the dive sites and surface signal tubes are recommended for all CIDA trips.**

The cost is \$135.00 if paid before June 19th and includes 3 dives, food and air. Board at 6:30am with the Raptor departing at 7:30am, the approx. time back to the dock is 4:00-4:30pm. [For more information see the CIDA website.](#)

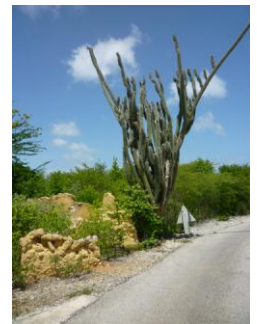
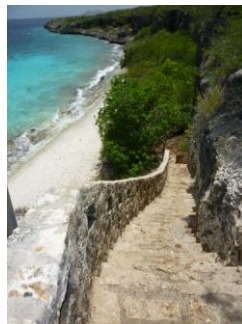


Bonaire Trip Report

This trip was long overdue for me and much needed. This trip was put together by CIDA for the Channel Islands Divers dive club for May 28th-June 5th staying at the Buddy Dive Resort. The Vis was 50'-100' and I seen lots of cool things.
